## PRIVATE HEALTH INSURANCE (PROSTHESES) AMENDMENT RULES 2018 NO. 1

The delegate of the Minister for Health has made the *Private Health Insurance (Prostheses)*Amendment Rules 2018 No. 1 (the Amendment Rules), to amend the *Private Health Insurance (Prostheses) Rules 2018 (No. 1)* – commonly known as the February 2018 Prostheses List. The Amendment is only relevant to **PART B – Human Tissue**, of the Prostheses List.

The Amendment Rules were registered on the Federal Register of Legislation on 13 March 2018 and commence 14 March 2018. Amendment Rules 2018 No. 1 will come into effect on 14 March 2018.

Amendment Rules 2018 No. 1 contain one Schedule as follows:

After the entry for Billing Code SYN05, insert:

## 1g Demineralised Bone Matrix

OHV14 Queensland Tissue Bank \$839.00

After the entry for Billing Code SYN13, insert:

Bone, Cancellous, Engineered

QHV13 Queensland Tissue Bank \$3,908.00
