Review of draft guidance - Complying with the Unique Device Identification regulations for medical devices

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About Private Healthcare Australia

Private Healthcare Australia (PHA) is the Australian private health insurance industry's peak representative body. We have 21 registered health funds throughout Australia as members and collectively represent 98% of people covered by private health insurance. PHA member funds provide healthcare benefits for over 14.4 million Australians.

1. Was the content relevant to your needs?

Private Healthcare Australia (PHA) supports the regulatory changes being proposed for UDI to help improve patient safety and provide faster identification of devices implanted into patients in the event of an adverse event, safety alert or recall. But PHA recommends an additional requirement be placed on sponsors to require any device that has a Prescribed List (PL) billing code associated with it have this code also documented on the registry.

This simple addition is something that all sponsors will already be familiar with as they require PL codes to invoice hospitals at the correct rate. Having this data readily available on the registry would dramatically improve the efficiency and speed of any product recalls or safety warnings for devices that have been implanted or used on patients who have utilised their private health insurance for the procedure.

Currently, almost 15 million Australians have private health insurance, and health funds collect detailed records of all medical procedures. In addition, all PL listed devices associated with each procedure are also recorded by health insurers, including the date of implantation, surgeon and hospital. Therefore, patients, hospitals and medical practitioners could be quickly notified about any issues with any medical devices.
